5W and an H questions that will come up as you read the text to try and understand it

1. When you ask, "**Who?**" you want to know— what or which person or people
2. When you ask, "**What?**" you want to know— specific information about someone or something
3. When you ask, "**When?**" you want to know—
 - At, on, or during what time, in what or which circumstances someone acts or something happens
4. When you ask, "**Where?**" you want to know—
 - At, in, or to what or which place or position, what or which situation or condition someone or something does something
5. When you ask, "**Why?**" you want to know— for what reason or purpose someone acts or something happens
6. When you ask, "**How?**" you want to know—
 - In what way or manner, or by what means someone acts or something happens
 - The condition/quality of someone or something
 - To what extent or degree someone acts or something happens
 - The way in which someone acts or something happens

BEFORE YOU START, REVIEW WORKSHEET 2

1. **Reread** the way you targeted the passage
2. **Scan** your SnapShot of the passage

GO AHEAD AND PROBE THE PASSAGE

1. **Read** your passage slowly and thoughtfully, **concentrating** on what you color-tagged in the text
2. **Begin** probing with **simple** questions that the **passage** can answer by itself:
 - What is it?
 - What does it do?
 - What do I see?
 - Where did it happen?
 - Who was involved?
 - When did it happen?

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3. **Write** in the left-hand column of Worksheets 3, 4 any **terms** that still need explaining, **questions** you have, **problems** you have understanding something, and **dead-ends** you run into
4. Let the **text** explain unclear terms, answer questions, solve problems, break through dead-ends
5. **Move on** to **deeper** questions that the **passage** can answer—with help from your **notes** and **related texts** in the **same** book:
 - I wonder why...
 - What caused...
 - How come/did/would/could...
 - I think...so...
 - This is important because...
 - What does the author mean by...
 - What I find confusing is...
 - As I read, I keep wanting to ask...
 - What are the consequences...
 - What will happen next...
 - What does this suggest...
6. If the text **plus** notes can't field your questions: (1) use the **margin** of your Study Bible, or (2) look up in your **Concordance**, items that you tagged most in the passage—to find **related** verses in the **same** book that you are studying
7. **Write/revise** any definitions, answers, solutions, or breakthroughs in the right hand column of the worksheets

QuikReflect

1. Look over Worksheets 3, 4 and your Textsheets
2. Separate what you know from what you don't
 - Ask, "This reminds me of..."
 - Ask, "I can relate to this because..."
3. Compare what you already know with the lesson of the text
 - Does the text back up what I already know?
 - Did it show me something I didn't know?

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
